Texas requests photo ID to vote in person.

ID must have your name and photo

You can vote a regular ballot if you show:

Can be expired for up to 4 years (more time after 70th birthday)

- · TX driver's license
- · TX state ID card
- TX Election ID Certificate
- · US passport or passport card
- US Citizenship Certificate
- Military ID
- TX handgun license

If you don't have an acceptable photo ID, you can show:

- Voter registration certificate
- · Certified US birth certificate
- Current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, or government check or document (e.g. employee ID, out-of-state license) with your name and any address

And, ask to complete and sign a Reasonable Impediment Declaration form to vote a regular ballot.
