



GUIDE TO VOTER ID RULES IN TEXAS

UPDATED: APRIL 2021

ACCEPTABLE PHOTO IDS FOR VOTING IN PERSON

You can cast a regular ballot if you present one of the following IDs:

- Texas Driver's License
- Texas Personal ID Card
- Texas Election ID Certificate
- Handgun License
- Military ID Card
- US Passport
- US Citizenship Certificate (does not expire)

NOTE: Your ID must be unexpired **or** expired up to 4 years. Your ID can be expired more than 4 years **if** you are 70 years or older.

If you do not have one of the IDs listed above, you can cast a regular ballot if you present a supporting form of ID (below) **AND** complete and sign "Reasonable Impediment Declaration."

Supporting forms of ID:

- Voter registration certificate
- Certified US (including territory) birth certificate
- Current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck (must show your name and ANY address)
- Government check (must show your name and ANY address)
- Any other government document showing your name and ANY address (examples: government employee ID, out-of-state driver's license)

Important note: An election officer is *not* permitted to question the reasonableness of your impediment to getting an ID.
