

North Carolina has a new voter ID law in effect!



Voting in Person

You can cast a regular ballot if you present an acceptable photo ID.

Following IDs must be unexpired or expired less than one year. Your ID can be expired any amount of time if it expires after your 65th birthday:

- North Carolina driver license
- North Carolina state ID card
- U.S. Passport or passport card
- NC voter ID issued by county
- NC student ID approved by state
- Employee ID approved by state
- Out-of-state driver's license or ID card
(Only voters who register within 90 days of election)

Following IDs are not required to have issuance or expiration date:

- Military ID card issued by US Government
- Veterans ID card issued by VA
- Tribal enrollment card

If you do not have one of the photo IDs listed above:

You may still vote if you cast a provisional ballot and complete/sign an ID exception form.

"Reasonable impediment" exceptions for not having an ID include lack of transportation, work schedule, family responsibilities, lost ID, and more.



Voting by Mail

Any registered North Carolina voter can request an absentee ballot.

You will need to provide specific identifying information when you request an absentee ballot **and** a copy of acceptable photo ID when you return it.
