

Voter ID Rules



Voting in Person

You can cast a regular ballot if you present one of these photo IDs:

- Texas driver's license
- Texas personal ID card
- Texas election certificate
- U.S. Passport book or card
- Handgun license
- Military ID
- U.S citizenship certificate
(Does not expire)

Your ID must be unexpired or expired up to 4 years. It can be expired longer if you are 70 years or older.

If you do not have one of the IDs listed above:

You can cast a regular ballot if you present a supporting form of ID and complete/sign a "Reasonable Impediment Declaration."

Supporting IDs

- Voter registration certificate
- Certified U.S. birth certificate
(including territory)
- Current utility bill, bank statement,
or paycheck*
- Government check*
- Other government document*
(Examples: employee ID, out-of-state ID)

*Must show your name and any address.



Voting by Mail

Only certain voters are eligible to vote by absentee ballot in Texas.

You must include specific identifying information twice – when you apply for your ballot and when you return it.
