

Pennsylvania's Voter ID Rules

Voting in Person

Pennsylvania asks for ID the first time you vote in your precinct.

You can use one of these photo IDs:

- PA driver's license
- PA state ID card
- Photo ID issued by PA or US government
- US passport or passport card
- Military ID
- High school or college ID
- Employee ID

Or you can use a non-photo ID that has your name and address:

- Voter registration card
- Firearm permit
- Non-photo ID issued by PA or US government
- Current utility bill, bank statement, or paycheck

Voting by Mail

Any registered Pennsylvania voter can vote by mail.

When you request your mail-in ballot, you need to provide:

- Number from your PA driver's license or state ID card (if you have one)
- Last 4 digits of your Social Security number (if you don't have PA license or state ID card)

If you don't have any of these numbers:

- Check the box on your application form
- Include copy of an accepted form of ID
