

Texas' Voter ID Rules

Voting in Person

You can vote a regular ballot if you show one of these photo IDs:

Ok if expired for up to 4 years (more time after 70th birthday)

- TX driver's license
- TX state ID card
- TX Election ID Certificate
- US passport or passport card
- US Citizenship Certificate
- Military ID
- TX handgun license

If you don't have an accepted photo ID, show:

- Voter registration certificate
- Certified US birth certificate
- Current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or other government document with your name and an address

And ask to complete and sign a Reasonable Impediment Declaration to vote a regular ballot.

Voting by Mail

Absentee ballots in Texas are only for some voters.

You must give one of these numbers on **BOTH** your application and your completed ballot:

- TX driver's license number
- TX state ID card number
- TX Election ID Certificate number

If you do not have these numbers, provide:

- Last 4 digits of Social Security number

2026 Primary Election

Voter Registration Deadline: February 2

Deadline to Request Mail Ballot: February 20

Early Voting: February 17 - February 27

Election Day: March 3
