

North Carolina's Voter ID Rules

Voting in Person

North Carolina asks for photo ID to vote in person. Registered voters without a photo ID can still vote by signing an ID exception form.

You can use:

Ok if expired up to 1 year (voters 65+ may use an expired ID if ID was unexpired on their 65th birthday)

- NC driver's license
- NC state ID card
- US passport or passport card
- NC voter ID issued by County BOE
- NC Student ID approved by NCSBE
- Employee ID approved by NCSBE
- Out-of-state driver's license or ID card

(Only voters who register within 90 days of election)

No expiration date required

- Military ID
- Veterans Health ID card issued by VA
- Tribal enrollment card issued by a tribe recognized by NC state or federal government

Voting by Mail

Provide one of these numbers when you request an absentee ballot:

- NC driver's license number
- NC state ID card number
- Last 4 digits of your Social Security number

You must also include a copy of accepted photo ID, or if you do not have a photo ID, a completed ID exception form when you return your ballot, or if you do not have a photo ID a completed ID exception form"

2026 Primary Election

Voter Registration Deadline: February 6

Deadline to Request Mail Ballot: February 17

Statewide Early Voting: February 12 - 28
(Same-day registration available during early voting!)

Election Day: March 3
